CREATING A BEST PRACTICE FOR ASPIRING INTERNATIONALLY CERTIFIED FARMS



Many farmers have difficulties with attaining international certification. This is largely due to insufficient knowledge and training on Global G.A.P. and organic farming, and a lack of experience on accessing international markets. This situation allows other countries to import fruits and vegetables to Indonesia, but restricts Indonesian farmers to export their own produce.

OBJECTIVE

To share knowledge on G.A.P. and organic farming techniques and certification processes, and serve as a national best practice for local farmers to successfully access regional and international markets.

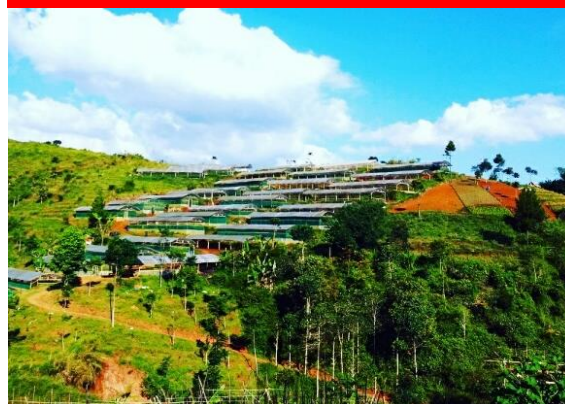
To reach this objective, GIZ has partnered up with Saribhakti Bhumi Agri, a farm that already has been certified on quality management. Saribhakti Bhumi Agri was chosen as a partner due to their dedication and commitment towards becoming a “locomotive farming powerhouse” that aims to benefit all stakeholders in the Indonesian farming industry. Together with GIZ, the farm will raise awareness on the importance and opportunities of certification, showcase its many benefits, and organize trainings for other interested and motivated farmers in the G.A.P. and organic certification process. This will make certification more attainable and tangible for many farmers.

EXPECTED RESULTS

- Saribhakti Bhumi Agri Farm is converted to a Global G.A.P. and organic certified farm
- A training center on G.A.P. and organic certification, as well as on Agroecology and Agropreneur is established
- Regional and international market access is gained and regional networks are developed, and used a best practice
