What is the regional and/or sectoral topic of this activity?

Communication for climate action and nature conservation/rehabilitation has been led mostly by scientific and research-based knowledge. While important, this type of communication tend to exclude communities, especially those that depend on ecosystem services for their livelihoods. This project aims remedy this disconnect by developing (digital) knowledge product (possibly a graphic novel. a short film, or other digital modes) that tell local peoples' stories on climate migration, sustainable transport, and coastal and river basin ecosystem protection/rehabilitation. Additionally, these knowledge products will be used to amplify the voices of the most vulnerable sectors, including women and girls, by especially highlighting gendered and rural impacts of climate change.

The knowledge product will be developed using storytelling research data (primarily from HMCCC research), and created in digital formats, with some print materials (where applicable) for rural areas with limited access to the internet & digital tools. Artists, such as writers, digital illustrators and/or filmmakers will be contracted to develop these knowledge products, based on the stories from the work done by the abovementioned projects so far. Where applicable, the knowledge products will use local languages (Bisaya, Tagalog, Waray, etc.) for the benefit of the rural communities, with English translation/subtitles.

More importantly, combining the benefits of ecosystems protection, mitigation action, and (migration as) adaptation activities will also present both the holistic outlook required of relevant climate action, but also highlight the challenges inherent in such systems-based approach.
